Summer is over and football is here. School started back this week and Ashley and I sent our little man off on the big yellow bus for the first time yesterday. Noah is so excited about school, especially riding the bus. However, he did come home yesterday and say the playground was "useless". I can't say that we have ever heard him use this term before, but it was comical. The thing I love most is that Noah and I have a brief devotional each morning before he goes to school. We are circling back through the commandments, but this time around we are discussing them in more detail. For instance yesterday I asked Noah what he knows about God, since there is only one God. He said, God is helpful, a protector, loving, He listens to our prayers, and is all powerful. This morning as we talked about false idols and we remembered yesterday that God was a protector, we asked God through prayer to protect our hearts from the false idols of this world. This truly is a new extreme joy of being a Dad to spend time each morning in the Word with Noah before entrusting him to God as we send him into the world. In May we hosted two year end parties for our students and families of the after school programs. We also hosted two outreach events in a local park. As Noah and Treveon were vacuuming their parents cars God said that I should reward the boys, so I pulled them together and talked about honoring and obeying their parents and things will go well for them. I then gave the boys each five dollars. Also in May, a young lady, Jessica, whom we have ministered off and on for the past couple of years was baptized. God provided me an opportunity to preach a message at a Catholic funeral, in the Catholic Church, during the month of May. That was a unique experience. One lady came up to me at the end of the service and said, "I watched the Priests while you were speaking and they were eye balling you, ready to correct you if you were to say something improper". And finally in May we held a Krispy Kreme fundraiser with our middle and high school students that was more fun than raiser. However, the kids worked hard and this was the point of doing the event.

Over the summer we took 14 of our students to Beach Camp with a local church partner. While we were there two students, Ruby and Sophia, were baptized. Also, Hilario and Adrian went with me one afternoon to the peer to share our faith with the beach community of Myrtle Beach, SC. The boys did a great job sharing their testimonies with strangers. They were nervous but overcame their fear by the blood of the Lamb, amen! In addition to beach camp we hosted four different Vacation Bible Schools in local apartment communities with the help four different church partners. We also transported students to a fifth VBS held at a local church campus. Due to these events hundreds of students and adults listened to the Gospel message being proclaimed and the Body of Christ revealed the message delivered to the community through personal interaction, free food, and free games. The one thing I have come to realize in our ministry is how impactful these large events are for disciple making. We normally do not see a lot of response at the event, but the amount of one on one ministry opportunities that God creates from these events is amazing. Here is one testimony: a first grade student who is part of one of the after school programs went to the VBS at a local church partner's campus. There the students were raising money to help buy beds for orphans in Africa. Jesus (child's name) was broken for the need of these kids and he went around to each of his neighbors asking for donations. Jesus raised \$140 on his own! Praise the Lord!

Another unique story from this summer came from our middle and high school students. In late June I took the students on a hike in North Georgia, but before going on the hike we stopped by Victory Home so I could preach at the noon Chapel service. It was a blessing to show the students first hand where I began my relationship with Jesus. It was also a blessing to preach a message that my students could hear. We operate in a teaching capacity with our discipleship so this was a first for them to hear me preach. I even incorporated our youth in the service. Adrian shared his testimony and I had the students circle around the men of Victory Home and declare for their hearts to be turned to the children they had left behind because of substance abuse. Powerful! The students and I also went tubing down the Chattahoochee River this summer. The water was a booming 53 degrees but many of the students talked about how quiet and peaceful it was on the river. I love seeing these students being exposed to new adventures like hiking and tubing. The tranquility and beauty of nature declares the glory of God amen! Thanks for giving to the ministry to help make all of this possible.

In preparation of her arrival I worked diligently all summer painting the interior of our home. I reckon after 12 years it is time for a fresh coat of paint.
